



THE WOBBLE CUT AND SHUFFLE

1. The cards are held in dealing position.
2. Three-quarters of the deck is lifted by the standard lift. (Photo 1)
3. The thumb goes to the inner edge of the lifted stock near the top, while the forefinger is at the outer short edge of the lifted portion. (Photo 2)
4. The thumb and forefinger grasp about four-fifths of the upper portion. (Photo 3)
5. The thumb and forefinger swivel their stock outwards. At the same time the second, third and little fingers swing their portion in and under the other section. (Photo 4)
6. This action is continued until the two upper packets are almost aligned. (Photo 5)
7. At this point the thumb and forefinger release a top small section of their packet onto the one held by the three fingers. (Photo 6)
8. After about three such gyrations, the thumb and forefingers leave their remaining cards on top of the others.
9. There are two different endings. Either the cut ends with the last packet left on top and fingers are withdrawn leaving the cards in dealing position or;
10. The merged upper three-quarters of the deck remain in the standard lift position. In this the forefinger and thumb lever the bottom small stock over the rest of the deck as in the Simple Simon Cut. (Photo 7)
